Welfare lien legislation (HB6516) was passed by the House of Representatives last week and the Senate on Monday! Church Community & Business News

Building & Grounds: Moving Forward and Keeping the Congregation Well Informed

In our 2/24 USH-Enews, Building and Grounds sought comments and suggestions on a proposal. The proposal responds to Board Listening Session, in which USH members and friends stressed the desirability of having streaming services from the Sanctuary and/or Fellowship Hall. This streaming capability would be valuable particularly now, but also in the future when we return to full attendance.

A zoom session on March 1, a discussion of B & G plans and commentary by congregation members produced useful and thoughtful suggestions.

In the session attended by 19 individuals, Jon Covault and Paul Cipriano

explained the proposed plan to upgrade our electronic ability to stream services and related content from the Sanctuary. Thoughtful reactions, comments, and observations then informed the Zoom discussion for the next 75 (or so) minutes.

There was unanimous agreement on two general principles.

First, during this time of accelerated change in the life of USH, the project should go forward both to prepare for what the future **will** deliver (think, make our Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall well equipped for current and future inhabitants of our landmark Meeting House). In addition, we will both symbolically and actually be making desirable electronic improvement to our historic building.

Second, keep the congregation members fully informed as the project moves forward. This is especially important as what might be termed "informational inclusion" is both essential to the collective feeling of belonging to "Team USH", and a challenging goal when, dispersed under Covid conditions, we meet by electronic means.

On specific issues, we learned the chancel audio system was upgraded just about when Covid arrived a year ago. Consequently, it is ready to feed audio to parts of the streaming apparatus. Participants also noted the contemplated electronic items are not aesthetically prominent, so the degree of member concern does not reach that for the pending upgrade to Sanctuary lighting. (Yes, that project is still in progress).

Questions revealed the equipment acquisition will make possible transmission of services to those at home when installed, both before we return to full attendance at the Meeting House and after, but will also be more responsive to the needs of challenged individuals not otherwise able to participate in USH activities, always an important concern. There will be associated ability to participate in meeting and similar events.

Worship Associates present, Laurie Kelliher, Margaret Leicach and Sue Smolski expressed enthusiasm for the potential of the new equipment as existing arrangements have been, shall we say, a bit of a challenge from within the Sanctuary. Producing future streaming services with the backdrop of the Chancel will be a wonderful improvement both under Covid requirements when only the "actors" are present and in the future with full attendance.

The next project briefing is scheduled for Fellowship Hour on March 14th.

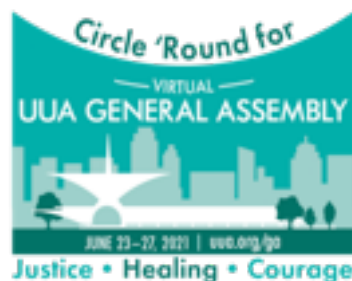

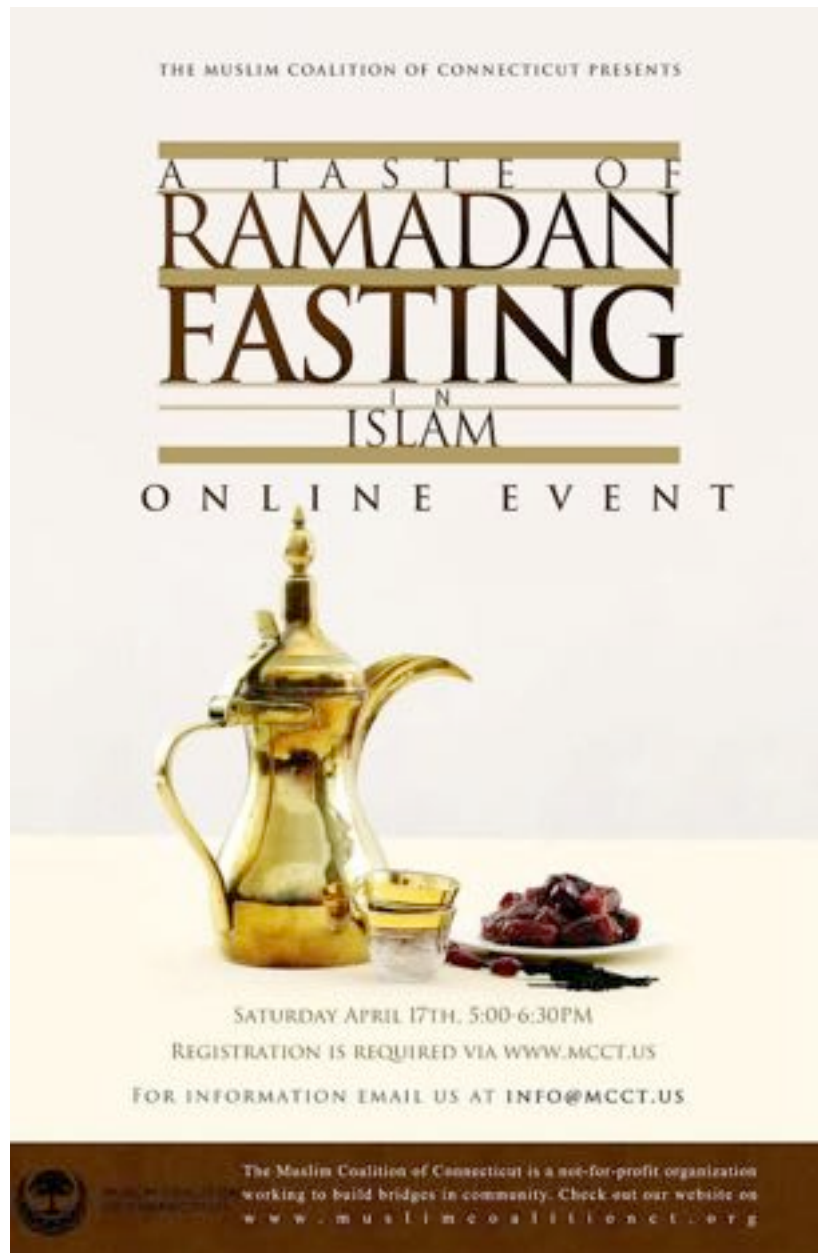
